A LOOK AT LEADING AN ORGANIZATION DEDICATED TO EMPOWERING AND EQUIPPING LEADERS

As we turn the page on our 13th year as The Gathering of Leaders community, I'd like to reflect for a moment on the extraordinary work of this movement within the Episcopal Church. Bishop Claude Payne's vision of a network of young, creative, hope-filled clergy passionately committed to the missionary call of Jesus Christ has become a reality that has impacted our Church in remarkable ways.

Our focus has always been on mission, evangelism, and the renewal of the Episcopal Church. Over the past year (2018) we have looked at those core concepts through the lens of race and the challenges that our struggles with racial reconciliation present to us as missionaries in this divided culture. Our theme for 2019 expands on the challenges of race and asks us to consider how we can present the saving love of Jesus Christ in the deeply divided cultural context of this moment. The last five sessions have all been filled to capacity. The conversations have been remarkable and life-giving, and those who are finding creative and Spirit-led ways through the challenges of the moment have shared what they are learning. The result has been a renewed energy and renewal within the Church as

we have begun to see even the most painful of experiences as an opportunity for the Holy Spirit to do a new and transformative thing.

Over this past year we have taken the necessary legal steps to become a separate 501(c)3 non-profit corporation, distinct from the Seminary of the Southwest, our home for the past several years. Though we were never financially supported by the Seminary, we have been housed under their non-profit status in order to receive major grants. We are deeply indebted

to the hospitality of SSW, but the Board of GOL believes it is now time to become a fully independent entity. The final separation will take place May 31.

Much of my energy over the past year has been spent developing new models of financial sustainability for The Gathering of Leaders now that our generous grants from Trinity Church, New York, and the Lilly Foundation have come to an end. Conversations with individuals and institutions both within and outside of the Episcopal Church have been encouraging, and we are hoping to announce within the next few months a new financial model that will ensure the sustainability of GOL into the future. Until that time I will continue my fundraising efforts with a series of conversations with lay persons around the country who wish to contribute to the viability of this community of clergy leaders.

It has been my great joy to have been a part of The Gathering of Leaders since the very beginning and to have served as the Chair of the Board for the past three years. To watch the development of what was once only a gleam

in Bishop Payne's eye mature into a major instrument of transformation in our Church has been a real blessing to me. Mrs. Haley Bankey, our Executive Director for the past 18 months, has brought a youthful vision and energy and a wide array of skills perfectly suited to this moment in GOL's history. Every day I give thanks to her commitment to this ministry.

Finally, it has been a profound gift to me to have been able to get to know so many of you through the years. I am inspired by your devotion and commitment to our Lord, and your desire to be instruments of grace, healing, and hope. May God continue to bless and sustain you. We are here to help you live fully and faithfully into this unique vocation of leadership in Christ's Church.

A LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

RECONCILIATION, RESEARCH, AND REJUVENATION: A YEAR OF ENGAGING, TOUGH CONVERSATION THAT WILL SHAPE OUR FUTURE

In response to the Presiding Bishop's call, the theme for 2018 was Racial Reconciliation in the Missionary Church, and we new it would be a challenging year. Heading into the year, our participants fell into one main demographic category: white. How would we truly discuss and chew on this topic without broader diversity in our own ranks?

Through very targeted recruitment, peer invitation, and quality Gatherings, we increased our participants of color by 174% during 2018 and truly broadened the conversation, allowing for deeper, more effective dialogue over this difficult topic. You can read first-hand accounts later in this report.

From its beginning The Gathering of Leaders has served to connect young, creative, proven clergy-leaders in the Episcopal Church through peer learning. Through this work GOL has impacted hundreds of congregations and thousands of people around the world. But what next?

During 2018 we took the time to analyze our numbers, dive into our history, survey our participants, and hear the stories of impact throughout the Church. These learnings, along with deep prayer, are shaping our future.

As you will see, 2018 was one of our most successful program years yet, but we're not ready to stop there. Our offerings and connectivity continue to grow, and with it, the future of the Church.




OUR GROWTH

Our membership grows through peer nomination and approval by Bishops. During 2018, 166 new nominations were approved and almost 45% of those have already registered to attend.






Through targeted efforts in 2018 we grew in the number of clergy of color who have attended, deepening the conversation and perspective at each Gathering.

RACIAL RECONCILIATION

IN THE MISSIONARY CHURCH



Our Presiding Bishop has called us into a deeper understanding of the relationship between evangelism and racial reconciliation. It has been said that Sunday morning is the most segregated time in America, because our worshipping communities often reflect the dividing lines of race rather than the unity of Christ's Body or the glorious diversity of God's creation. At this year's gathering we wish to explore the connection between discipleship, mission, and racial reconciliation. We understand ourselves, as Christians. to be called to reconciliation. How does making disciples facilitate and celebrate racial reconciliation in our particular contexts? How are the church's legacies of racial division and racial healing affecting your work of evangelism and mission? What signs of hope do you see? Within the context of the Great Commission, what roles do confession, repentance, forgiveness and reparation play in the work of racial reconciliation within ourselves, our congregations and the Episcopal Church?






DIOCESE BENEFIT AS BISHOPS PARTICIPATE

Already in 2019 we've launch our brand new Participants' Directory, and later in 2019 we will launch peer-led webinars focused on creative methods of ministry and an online community forum with shared resources sourced from our participants and their congregations.

Our Gatherings will stay the primary way of supporting, connecting, and encouraging our participants in their missionary call, but these additional resources will serve to keep us all connected in between those time when we can come together in person.
